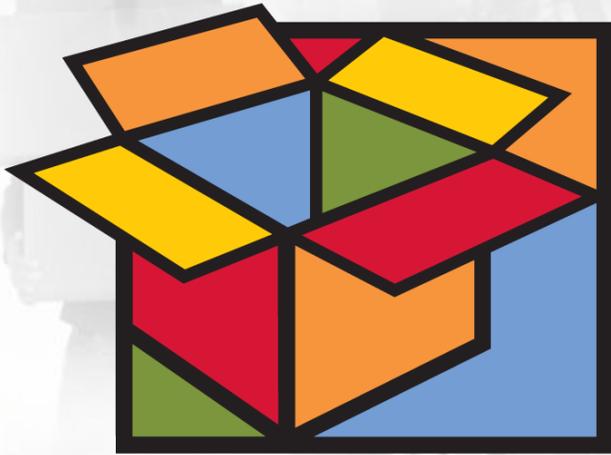

# Emergency Relocation- Preparation

## ■ PREPARATION

- Proper Prior Planning Prevents Particularly Poor Performance

# Emergency Relocation- Preparation

- **PREPARATION**
  - The Plan is Nothing, Planning is Everything
- **It's what the military spends over 90% of it's time doing.**



# Emergency Relocation- Assessment

## EVENT DICTATES COURSE OF ACTION

- **Immediate Damage Assessment**
  - Death/Injury
  - What has been lost/disrupted?  
Transportation/Communication/Power/Water/Shelter
- **Event Area – Localized vs. Wide-spread**
- **Types of Emergencies – How They Affect You-**
  - At Home
  - At School
  - At Work
- **Evacuate/Safe Haven vs. Shelter in Place?**



# Emergency Relocation- Event/Assessment

- **Civilian Response / Military Response**
- **Civilian**
  - Federal/State/County/City/Neighborhood/School/Work/Home
- **Military**
  - Region/Base/Command (Deployed?)

**Are these responses coordinated?**

# Emergency Relocation-RECOVERY

- **Medical Assistance/First Aid?**
- **Communication**
  - Phone/Radio/Television/Internet
- **Transportation**
- **Shelter/Food**


